

CrossWay International's Strategy

CrossWay International focuses on a number of areas as a means of outreach.

Water Well Drilling--We have drilled wells in Sudan (near Darfur), Kenya, Ethiopia, Tanzania, and we have plans to drill more in other parts of Africa and Central America.

Orphans--We support orphans and needy kids in Ethiopia, Liberia, Kenya, and other countries as we encounter them. We help provide food, shelter, and schooling if possible.



Medical Clinics--One of our medical clinics, which we recently established, is specifically for these orphans. We are opening a second medical clinic in Meki, Ethiopia.

Schools-- Our school in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, is self-supporting. A second school in Sudan is meeting the needs of the orphans there through the devotion of ten teachers, whom we support full-time.

Pastors' Conferences and Evangelistic Events-- We sponsor pastors' conferences and evangelistic events in many parts of the world, including Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda, Ethiopia, Liberia, and Nicaragua to date.

God uses all of these various ministries as a platform to reach out to the truly impoverished and lost of our world and gain a hearing for the gospel. As an African proverb says, "Empty stomachs have no ears."

CrossWay International's History

CrossWay International was founded in 1997 by Dean and Joan Chollar, when they returned from Belgium where they had been missionaries for 11 years.

CrossWay International's main focus is on evangelistic work overseas. Dean Chollar has traveled to 50+ countries (in spite of his physical blindness) to share the gospel, lead evangelistic campaigns, preach and teach in various capacities, and to encourage local Christian leaders. In addition, CrossWay embraces opening doors for sharing the gospel through numerous overseas projects, including income-generating projects and providing critical aid to those in need.

We are also available to help the stateside churches with evangelistic materials, equipping seminars and teaching, preaching and motivational speaking.

As the ministry has grown, God has also brought alongside a gifted staff, and 4 new missionaries, in addition to our coworkers overseas.

Personal History

Isaac was born into a Christian family in the remote town of Gbonnie, Liberia. He attended church services and conferences at an early age, and at fourteen, his mother helped him to personally put his trust in the Lord alone as his Savior. Isaac says, "This decision changed my life and my world view. I was no longer depending on my parents' faith but personally trusting Jesus Christ as my Savior."

Even though his parents were uneducated, they sent Isaac to school for greater ministry. He completed 6th grade in his home town and later entered the LAMCO School for junior high education. Upon completing high school in N'Zerekore Refugee School in 1996, he enrolled at the Liberia Christian College in 1998 and obtained a Bachelors Degree in theology (BATH) in 2002. Isaac was then ordained as minister of the Gospel in the United Liberia Inland Church in 2005.

Isaac has served the Lord in the United Liberia Church in the following capacities: Sunday School teacher from 1989 to 1994, local and regional youth leader from 1992 to 1995, General Secretary, ULIC Guinea Ministry 1995 to 1997, Principal, Tiayee Inland Mission 1997 to 1998, Church Administrator, ULIC Paynesville from 1999 to 2003, Assistant and Head Pastor, ULIC VP Road (ULIC headquarters church) from 2004 to 2006, founder and pastor ULIC Central Monrovia from 2007 to 2011, and is now pastor of ULIC ELWA. He has also served as classroom teacher in both public and Christian ministry-related schools and as a school administrator from 2005 to present. Most

recently, he has known and worked with Dean as Crossway Representative in Liberia from June 2011 to present. Isaac and his wife, Rachel, have three children: Moses, Dorcas and Nyan.

The Ministry

Isaac will serve as Dean's right-hand man in Liberia and help us spearhead a number of ministries.

He has already arranged one Pastors' Conference (April/May 2011) where Dean and our Member Care Director taught over 30 Pastors from the Monrovia area. We hope to sponsor more such events, as they greatly strengthen the faith of church leaders and offer training that is difficult to find in such countries.

In addition to this, he works with Josephus Gersinee to oversee 3 other ministries. First is the care and feeding of 50 orphans and needy kids that we support monthly. Second, he is establishing our new water well drilling ministry in this country. And third, he will arrange evangelistic events for which the previous ministries lay the groundwork. We see the greatest response to the message of God's grace when we provide tangible needs that touch people's lives in vital ways.
