

CrossWay International's Strategy

CrossWay International focuses on a number of areas as a means of outreach.

Water Well Drilling—We have drilled wells in Sudan (near Darfur), Kenya, Ethiopia, Tanzania, and we have plans to drill more in other parts of Africa and Central America.

Orphans—We support orphans and needy kids in Ethiopia, Liberia, Kenya, and other countries as we encounter them. We help provide food, shelter, and schooling if possible.



Medical Clinics—One of our medical clinics, which we recently established, is specifically for these orphans. We are opening a second medical clinic in Meki, Ethiopia.

Schools—Our school in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, is self-supporting. A second school in Sudan is meeting the needs of the orphans there through the devotion of ten teachers, whom we support full-time.

Pastors' Conferences and Evangelistic Events—We sponsor pastors' conferences and evangelistic events in many parts of the world, including Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda, Ethiopia, Liberia, and Nicaragua to date.

CrossWay International's main focus is on evangelistic work overseas. Dean Chollar has traveled to 50+ countries (in spite of his physical blindness) to share the gospel, lead evangelistic campaigns, preach and teach in various capacities, and to encourage local Christian leaders. In addition, CrossWay embraces opening doors for sharing the gospel through numerous overseas projects, including income-generating projects and providing critical aid to those in need.

As the ministry has grown, God has also brought alongside a gifted staff, and 4 new missionaries, in addition to our coworkers overseas.

Personal History

Gary Jones has served as the Senior Pastor of First Baptist Church of Camp Wood, Texas, for the past 8 years. Since earning a ThM from Dallas Theological Seminary in 1999, he has served as a pastor at churches in Texas, South Dakota, and Idaho. His wife Marcia is a Registered Nurse working in the emergency room of a local hospital. Gary and Marcia have two grown children and six grandchildren.



Before accepting God's call into pastoral ministry, Gary worked as an electrical engineer, designing communications and computer systems. Shortly after his children were born, Gary put his trust in Jesus Christ and soon began to experience the joy of studying the Bible and serving the Lord. One of the first ministries Gary became involved in was the church's evangelism training program. Soon Gary was teaching evangelism and preaching in a local nursing home. He also served as a deacon, altar counselor, and camera operator. Gary also taught evangelism on mission trips to Montana and South Africa.

In 1995 God opened the door for Gary and his family to move to Dallas, Texas, where Gary entered seminary to prepare for pastoral ministry. While there he worked part-time as a hospital chaplain, associate pastor, and mission fundraiser.

As a pastor, Gary's passion has been to use God's Word to transform the lives of people. Although Gary began his ministry career in a large suburban church, God has since led Gary to serve in small rural churches. Through the years, Gary has learned that every church is a unique ministry and that church growth begins with the spiritual growth of its leaders. In his commitment to develop the next generation of church leaders, Gary has taught seminary extension classes, developed accountability relationships with other pastors and church leaders, and served on the Board of Directors at CrossWay International.

Dean Chollar, CEO of CrossWay International, is excited about the potential growth of the pastors' conference and church seminar ministries under Gary's leadership.

The Ministry

Gary's focus will be the development and oversight of all training events in the USA and overseas. Preparation for these events will require coordination with host ministries in the USA and countries such as Kenya, Ethiopia, Liberia, Nicaragua, etc.

His specific responsibilities will include:

- Planning and Coordinating all pastors' conferences.
- Recruiting and overseeing conference teachers.
- Developing courses and materials for use in training.
- Conducting evangelism and other training seminars in churches.
