

CrossWay International's Strategy

CrossWay International focuses on these 5 main areas as a means of outreach:

- **Water well drilling-** We have drilled wells in Sudan (near Darfur), Kenya, Ethiopia, and Tanzania, and we hope to drill more in Africa, Central America, and other areas in the world.
- **Orphans-** We care for orphans and needy kids in Ethiopia, Kenya, Liberia, and Nicaragua. The CrossWay Coffee Ministry is a major source of support for these orphans. (www.crosswaycoffee.org)
- **Medical Clinics-** One of our medical clinics, which we recently established, is specifically for these orphans. We will soon have a second medical clinic up and running in Meki, Ethiopia. We also have a request to start one in Nicaragua.
- **Agricultural Training and Animal Husbandry-** In order to avoid the syndrome of dependency, we are sending a farming expert into Sudan to train the villagers to grow their own food and raise animals to feed these orphans.
- **Schools-** Our English Language School in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, is self supporting. A second school in Sudan is meeting the needs of the orphans there through the devotion of ten teachers.



CrossWay International's History

CrossWay International was begun in 1997 by Dean and Joan Chollar, when they returned from Belgium where they had been missionaries for 11 years. The initial focus was on evangelism and evangelism training overseas. The ministry has since grown to include several new and exciting avenues to reach the lost, in spite of Dean's physical blindness. God has also brought alongside a gifted staff to assist in the ministry.

A main focus of CrossWay International is to bring badly needed humanitarian aid to remote and impoverished areas where the larger NGOs (non-governmental organizations) are not willing to go. We are honored to take medicine, food, and the gospel of Jesus Christ to these remote and needy areas.

Another facet of the ministry involves coming alongside national churches and coworkers overseas. They play an essential role in helping us develop and extend our ministry throughout their country and the world.

God uses all of these various ministries as a platform to reach out to the truly impoverished and lost of our world and gain a hearing for the gospel. As an African proverb says, "Empty stomachs have no ears."

Crossway international-Kenya became registered in Kenya in June 2010. Before then I was still working for Crossway International since 2007 where Dean was overseeing 549 orphans in the Aweil area of South Sudan. Since then we have been involved in The Lords work guided by Psalms 82:3-4 that says "Defend the poor and fatherless: do justice to the afflicted and needy. Deliver the poor and needy: rid them out of the hand of the wicked."

In Kenya, we are mostly involved in drilling water wells. We also assist 45 blind kids in Kangundo D.E.B. School with Braille machines, slates and stylus and personal effects. Dean has traveled in Kenya several times and I have always assisted him while traveling to other African countries to reach the hurting world.
